



WHO & WHAT'S NEW FOR 2016

Ski Visits Increase in 2016: “El Nino” is being credited for a 50% increase in skier visits to Western North America this season. The snowpack figures were back up to “average” after the four previous drought years, and skier visits in the southwest region of California, Nevada, and Arizona, were up by 53.1% over the previous year. The Pacific Northwest saw an increase of 141.5%, while New England states actually took a dramatic down turn. It pays to live in the West. At least in did this past season.

Powdr Corp Buys Eldora Mountain Resort: Adding to their portfolio, Powdr Corp has just purchased *Eldora Mountain Resort*, in Colorado. Along with *Copper Mountain*, they now have two of the most accessible resorts to serve skiers. Colorado’s ‘ Front Range ’ is one of the best ski markets in the world. Eldora is thought of as a leading entry point and training ground for children and beginners. CEO and owner of Powdr, John Cumming says “We want to work hard for more people to join us in the adventure-filled world of snow sports.”

Arlberg To Be Largest Austrian Ski Region: Austria’s *Arlberg* ski region will be the country’s first area to offer almost 200 miles of lift-linked runs when a new project, physically joining the two largest areas around Lech and St. Anton, is completed. This is being done by installing four new gondolas this summer. With the completion of this project, *Arlberg* will move into the world’s top five areas in terms of size.

Dubai To Build New Indoor Resort: Dubai plans to build a new indoor resort which will be three times the size of the existing 400 meter-long *Ski Dubai*. The new addition will be a record 1,200 meter slope, and will stretch from the Meyden race track to Burj Khalifa. It is estimated that it will house up to 78,000 people once it is fully completed, which should be done within the next five years.

Brexit Effect On American Travelers: If a trip to the U.K. is in your future plans, you may want to take advantage of some of the crazy prices that are being offered up now, since Britain’s exit from the EU. Cash in on cheaper-than-normal flights. If you’ve already booked a flight, book as many other parts of your trip as possible now. Hotel rooms, activities, car rentals, and anything else you can book ahead of your travel dates will save you money. FAR WEST HISTORY

Far West History Program: The Far West History Program currently consists of three elements: the Club/Council History Recognition, Historic Ski Clubs Designation, and the Western Ski Heritage Award, sponsored by *Steamboat Ski Resort*. All three elements were successfully displayed at the 2016 Annual Meeting and Convention. The History Recognition was especially noteworthy because the research by Mary Azevedo presented an earlier date for the founding of Bay Area Skisports Council, which was 1940. This makes Bay Area the first Historic Ski Council and the Association's oldest. Thanks to the efforts of Maxine Hanlon and George Kish, we were able to verify two more Historic Ski Clubs – Vand Bakke (1950) and Snowbounders (1962) – in addition to the Phoenix Ski Club (1948 incorp). Arleigh Meiners has promised that Phoenix will be bringing its history to Boise next year. We will be asking the Intermountain Ski Council for dates and evidence of early ski clubs and histories. We now have 18 Historic Ski Clubs with the addition to the Bay Area Historic Ski Council.

We were fortunate to have submitted a video *Echoes of the Peaks, An Early History of Skiing in Northern Arizona*, written and produced by Jane Jackson of Flagstaff, winner of this year's Western Ski Heritage Award. She enlisted the support of Gavin Boughner for direction and production and with original music by Jesse Bouvier, operating as Cloud Chaser Filmworks. Both men are associated with Northern Arizona University.

The Snowsport Builder award is not technically a part of the History Program but draws on similar research resources. Jane is also the biographer for Jimmie Nunn, who was honored with the Association's Snowsport Builder Award. Nunn spent nearly three decades as an architect and ski area designer in Arizona. Unique for FWSA and the award, also honored was Ronnie Lupe who is singularly responsible for the development of Sunrise Ski Park on the tribal lands of the White Mountain Apache Tribe. Lupe was born in a wickiup on tribal lands and is the Chairman of the Tribal Council.
