



## WHO & WHAT'S NEW FOR 2017

**NSAA Awards Sustainable Slopes Grants:** The National Ski Areas Association (NSAA) has chosen four Member ski areas to receive its annual Sustainable Slopes Grants: *Arapahoe Basin, Colo.*, who will use their grant for HR and sustainability by utilizing their existing staff to help achieve sustainability goals. *Copper Mountain Resort, Colo.*, will be installing new snowmaking guns. *Granite Peak, Wis.* will install SnowBright lights; and *Mt. Bachelor, Ore.*, will install an infrared motion sensor control system in the Pine Marten Lodge.

**Squaw Valley/Alpine Meadows to Host 2018 NASTAR Championships:** *Squaw Valley* will host the 2018 Liberty Mutual Insurance NASTAR National Championships. It is the first time since 1981 the event will be held west of the Rocky Mountains. The Championships are scheduled for March 21-25, 2018. Under U.S. Ski & Snowboard, NASTAR continues to bring greater awareness to the sport and motivate participants of all ages to get involved in ski racing.

**Skiing in California all Summer Long:** Good News! *Mammoth* will be running their lifts through July 4<sup>th</sup> this year, and possibly longer. *Squaw Valley* plans to be open **all summer long**. The caveat to that is, it will only be open on Saturdays, after July 4<sup>th</sup>, and only to special season pass holders. You can't beat that for keeping your cool in August.

## FAR WEST CONVENTION

The Far West Ski Association conducted its 85<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention in Boise, Idaho June 7-11, hosted by the Bogus Basin Ski Club and Intermountain Ski Council. Our hosts assured there was fun for everyone! There were great outdoor activities, including a Taste of Idaho with a Dutch Oven Dinner, Rafting on the Payette River, the 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Michael German Memorial Golf Tournament, A Day on the Mountain at Bogus Basin, and a Boise Biking Tour.

A highlight on Saturday afternoon was Keynote Speaker, Charlie Linville. Charlie is the first military amputee to summit Mt. Everest. He presented an inspirational and motivational account of what he learned working with the *Hero's Project* in preparations for and eventual success in reaching the summit of Mt. Everest. Celebrity Guests included: *Laura Sankey*, President of Women's Ski Jumping USA; *Sarah Hendrickson*, World Champion Ski Jumper; and *Alan Alborn*, Head Coach of WSJUSA. Three sessions were presented in The Snowsports Leadership Academy with valuable information provided for club and council leaders. Oh Show! Productions recorded the Keynote Speaker and Snowsports Leadership Academy sessions, and copies of the presentations will be available soon to the clubs and councils.

The Silent Auction and Snowsports Trade Show on Friday evening raised close to \$30,000 to support FWSA programs. Awards were presented to volunteers and industry leaders, and election of officers were held on Sunday morning.
