## WHO & WHAT'S NEW FOR 2017-2018

**Mountain Solitude in Huts and Yurts:** Heading into the backcountry transports skiers and rider into a world of powder, mystery and quiet – especially if the trip includes a night or two out in the woods. More than 200 huts and yurts in North America lie under the tall peaks of the Rocky Mountains. Trail systems lead to single nights or connect to a multi-day hut-to-hut adventure for groups large and small. Check out the many trails throughout Colorado, Utah, Idaho, and Oregon for lodging that caters nightly dinners, or merely house comfy beds, a cook stove, fireplace and a warm cozy place to stay for the night.

**Happy Anniversary Beech Mountain Resort:** *Beech Mountain Resort* marks 50 years of skiing on the highest elevation, lift-served slopes in eastern America. The resort had a new vision for Southern skiing when it debuted in the winter of 1967-68. It was the only North Carolina resort built around an alpine village, and remains so today. To celebrate their 50<sup>th</sup> year, Beech Mountain will have “throwback” pricing throughout the season, on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays during their night sessions. Tuesdays are “ladies’ night” with \$9 lift tickets, and “mens’ night” is on Wednesday with \$9 tickets. Thursday will be “couples’ night” for \$14 first ticket and \$8 for the second. Come join us.

**Women’s Ski Clinics for 2017-2018:** Ladies, are you looking for a ski clinic to get you into that “ready for the season” shape? From Alyeska to Alta, and Big Sky to Killington, there are many clinics to choose from. While they aren’t a one-size-fits-all answer, there should be one for.
