SKIING HISTORY

The International Skiing History Association (ISHA) is a U.S. based organization working to preserve and build awareness of the sport's heritage through its skills and long experience in editing, research and publishing. ISHA publishes a magazine enthusiastically read six times a year by lovers of skiing, researchers, hall-of-fame members and skiers around the world. It makes ski history accessible to thousands of enthusiasts on the Internet. With

an awards program, it annually honors ski history writers, website creators, filmmakers and broadcasters who document the sport's history. ISHA's administrative office is located in the National Ski Museum of the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame, Ishpeming, Michigan. You can visit their webpage at *www.skihistroy.org* where you can find more information.

With the Olympics now in the rearview mirror it is interesting how that all started. The generation of men and women who took to recreational skiing on the Continent prior to the World War I looked to Scandinavia as the fount of all things skiing. The Continent's military noted the effectiveness of Norwegian ski troops and eventually emulated the notion. Russian, German, Austrian, Swiss and Italian regiments were experimenting with ski troops in the 1890s. The English were contemplating training ski soldiers to guard India's Himalayan frontier. The French soon followed.

After numerous machinations and permutations and with the support of several nations who began to view skiing and the mountain experience as a boon to healthy living more serious thought was given to major international competitions. Enter the Olympic presence: Winter Olympics had been contemplated since 1899. Pierre de Coubertin, founder of the modern Olympic Games and then president of the International Olympic Committee, was not especially noted for his keen interest in skiing. He had been impressed with previous, smaller and unofficial games (particularly the military skijoring races) run every four years. Not much thought had been given to trying to incorporate skiing into the Olympic program. He believed, in 1908, that skiing had a "hygienic value of the highest order" and called it "the best medicine for tuberculosis and neurasthenia."

After WWI, Chamonix was also growing apace in the twin categories of health center and ski station, particularly the latter. It developed the best lifts and the most expert terrain and was, in that sense, the country's most prestigious ski village. Chamonix in particular and the French in general had acquired an infrastructure and the experience needed to host ever larger winter competitions, both accumulated beginning in the prewar governmental programs concerned with health, war and tourism. The climax of all this effort came in 1924 when Chamonix was chosen as the site of what became, in retrospect, authorized as the First Winter Olympic Games.

SAFETY (from Pacific Northwest Ski Areas Association) Lift Load and Unload

Using and riding chair lifts when skiing and snowboarding is one of the primary safety considerations for users.

Prior to using any lift, you must have the knowledge and ability to load, ride and unload safely.

As you approach the lift read all signs and warnings. If you are unfamiliar with a lift please ask the attendant for help if needed. A skier's behavior has as much or more to do with the safety of the sport as does any piece of equipment from helmet to chair lift.

Kids on Lifts is an educational program specifically designed to help parents and children be aware of proper loading and unloading of chairlifts. The website, *www.kidsonlifts.org*, contains FAQ's and safety tips on how to load, ride and unload responsibly, general skiing and riding tips.

- B **Bottom to Bottom, Back to Back!** Keep your bottom on the seat and your back against the back of the chair.
- C Careful! Don't fool around on the lift. Face forward for the whole ride.

VAIL AND FOREST SERVICE DESTROY SMOKE SHACKS

(reprinted from the National Ski Club Newsletter – CAUTION!)

Vail Resorts and the U.S. Forest Service (USFS) have confirmed that a number of smoke shacks for marijuana use at Vail, Beaver Creek, Breckenridge and Keystone resorts have been destroyed over the past several weeks noting that, in spite of the passage of Amendment 64 last fall, public consumption of marijuana continues to be illegal under Colorado law and possession and consumption of marijuana continues to be illegal under federal law. Vail Resorts' four Colorado ski resorts – Vail, Beaver Creek, Breckenridge and Keystone – are located on U.S. Forest Service land, where possession and consumption of marijuana is illegal. In addition, using any ski lift or ski slope or trail while under the influence of drugs and alcohol is prohibited under the Colorado Ski Safety Act, and there is also "no smoking" of any kind permitted in any Vail Resorts owned and operated facilities, including restaurants, lodges and hotels, and officials will continue to enforce that policy.

NEW FROM NATIONAL SKI AREAS ASSOCIATION

NSAA is calling on all member ski areas to convert, convert! What is conversion? Conversion is simply the process of turning beginner skiers and riders into repeat customers, and ultimately lifelong enthusiasts of the sport. With this, NSAA has developed the Conversion Cup Challenge, a friendly competition among member ski areas that closely aligns with the industry's overall goals to grow the sport.

As NSAA's Growth Model outlines, conversion is not a short-term process but rather a long-term transformation. Yet the current demographics make it clear: Time is not on the industry's side. The Baby Boom generation continues to age and will ultimately hang up their ski and snowboard gear for good. Research shows that if we do not improve our efforts to introduce new participants to the sport - and convert them to lifelong enthusiasts - overall ski and snowboard visitation figures could decrease by 2.5 percent per season. NSAA's Conversion Cup Challenge is designed as a fun way to pique competition among member ski areas and recognize those who make significant efforts to boost skier and snowboarder conversion rates.

As part of the competition, applicants must provide a detailed overview of their program designed specifically to increase skier and rider conversion rates. Some parameters judges look for when making their selections:

- Increase in Level 1 lesson volumes;
- Level 1 lesson volumes in relation to total skier and snowboarder visits;
- Quantifiable success of multi-lesson packages;
- Season-to-date sales data on specific learn-to packages designed to drive repeat visitation;
- Overall data collection capabilities and sophistication;
- Marketing ingenuity, creativity, use of new media, etc.

The Conversion Cup is a traveling award. The winning resort will claim the Cup for a period of one year, until the next Conversion Cup winner is again crowned at the NSAA National Convention. Winners will receive a Conversion Cup plaque to keep on display at their ski area.

Due to the weather this year, our league races have been challenging to complete. I know one race weekend was rained out, and some others have had some venue changes, but most of the races have been completed.



A call to submit applications has been sent out to the ski clubs affiliated with the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Association's (USSA) Far West, Pacific Northwest, and Intermountain Divisions. These three divisions encompass all the USSA junior racers in California and Nevada (Far West Ski Association), Washington, Oregon and western Idaho (Northwest Ski Club Council) and Wyoming, Utah, eastern Idaho, and Las Vegas, NV (Intermountain Ski Council). In addition, announcements were sent to the Taos, Santa Fe and Flagstaff race teams. Athletes affiliated with these teams are eligible for scholarships; however, all three are members of the Rocky Mountain Division based, for the most part, in Colorado, and Colorado athletes are

not eligible. All told, the foregoing divisions represent 70 ski teams and approximately 1200 eligible athletes.

The 2013-2014 competition season is headed into its final weeks. Several FWSA scholarship recipients have found their way to podiums during the last four weeks: Samantha Busby, (Sun Valley, ID) a 2nd in Giant Slalom; Alexandria Oseland (Crystal Mountain, WA) a 1st and 2nd in Giant Slalom, and 3rd place finishes in Downhill and Super G; Garret Driller (Squaw Valley, CA) a 2nd in Giant Slalom; Hannah Hunsaker (Park City, UT) a 3rd place in Giant Slalom and a 1st,2nd, and 3rd in Slalom; and Riley Plant (Sugar Bowl, CA) finished 2nd and 3rd in Giant Slalom. With the exception of Alexandria Oseland's races, the athletes won their medals at the Western Regional Junior Championships at Squaw



Valley, CA, and/or the FIS Elite Wild West Classic at Snow King, WY. Alexandria's podiums were at the No Bull Giant Slalom at Crystal Mountain, WA, and the Sun Cup Downhill and Super G at Mt. Bachelor, OR. Congratulations to Lila Lipanja who has won the NorAm cup in Slalom. Lila finished first in points ahead of Hailey Duke of the U.S. and Kristina Riis-Johannessen of Norway. Lila is a five-time FWSA scholarship recipient.
