- Purchase or otherwise obtain enough reusable flatware, plates, wine glasses, bowls, glasses and cups for serving 150 people in my local community. Solicit donations and look for bargains at thrift stores.
- Organize a local "tableware share lending library" in neighborhoods
- SLO Skiers purchase reusable wine glasses for Club events on February and March ski trips to Steamboat and Mammoth.
- Commit to be zero waste by using refillable water bottles and washable dishes and flatware when possible.
- Prepare talking points for engaging with ski area lodges, hotels and concessions where food and beverages are served.

Congratulations, Janine, and thank you for your diligence in making your local club, your community, and your ski areas more conscientious about zero waste.
