Communications & Outstanding Club Awards	
<p>Description— The club and council communications awards are designed to promote excellence and outstanding performance. Entries are for the following five competitions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tollakson Outstanding Club of the Year • Wentworth Outstanding Club Publication of the Year • Wentworth Outstanding Council Publication of the Year • Outstanding Club Website Award • Outstanding Council Website Award. <p>This criteria for these awards is meant as a guideline for creating an attractive and functional design to promote excellence in your club.</p> <p>Classes— Club classes will be determined by the club’s performance over the previous 4 years. The four classes will be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Club Masters — 1st place Master or Advanced winner in the previous 4 years. • Club Advanced — 2nd or 3rd place Advanced or 1st place Novice winner in the previous 4 years. • Club Novice — Any new entry or 2nd, 3rd and no place Novice winner in the previous 4 years. • Council — As usual, is in a class of their own. <p>Clarifications— Classification is based on the Club or Council, not their editors or webmasters.</p> <p>Any club may volunteer to participate in any class above their actual designated classification during the online entry application process.</p> <p>Competition class rankings for outstanding club publication and website are determined independently. Clubs may be awarded in different classes based on previous awards.</p> <p>Who is Eligible— Any Far West club can apply for any of the awards— Publication, Website and Outstanding Club. Councils' Volunteer of the Year							
<p>Description— This award is presented to an outstanding individual at the grassroots level. Selection criteria is based on each individual's involvement in snowsports; club, council, regional and national activities; and knowledge and enthusiasm for snowsports. Candidates should have awareness of Far West programs and, in particular, its public affairs involvement.</p> <p>Criteria— Award covers participation for the past 5 years.</p> <p>Who is Eligible— Each council is invited to submit one individual for this award. Participating councils must also submit a judge. Councils may choose their method for designating candidates. <p>Description— The association is a constant proponent of safe skiing. Safety should be given the highest regard by both ski resorts and participants. Safety should be a forethought not an afterthought. Safety is no accident, safety is having fun consciously!</p> <p>This yearly award honors the person who has done the most to promote safety consciousness within the association during the previous two calendar years. Western Ski Heritage Award	
<p>Description— The Far West Western Ski Heritage program annually recognizes the best effort in the prior two years that finds, preserves, documents and shares the history of snowsports in the West.</p> <p>The purpose of the Far West Western Ski Heritage program is to raise awareness for snowsports participants and non-participants alike of the contributions made by individuals, groups, independent scholars, authors and companies to all aspects of snowsports – competitive as well as that of outdoor winter recreation and fitness activities.</p> <p>A parallel purpose is to convey the positive role snowsports has had in its contributions to the communities in the West. Materials and history programs will be evaluated against the objectives of the program by individuals selected for their knowledge of the history of western snowsports and that of the Association. Submissions should be of archival or library quality.</p> <p>Who is Eligible— The Award is open to an individual, a group or team and can be self-nominated or nominated by a member of a club, council, Far West or ski industry. Club & Council History Award	
<p>Description— The FWSA launched the History Recognition Program in 2008 to develop club, league and council histories.</p> <p>The objective of the program is to compile a set of histories that collectively will describe the history of organized skiing as a whole. It is important to collect information about snowsports from the participant’s perspective and especially that of the club skier/boarder.</p> <p>Selection for this award is based on digital (preferable) or mailed presentation of club or council history according to a set of weighted criteria and judged by knowledgeable ski historians.</p> <p>The History Recognition is not for outstanding club or council, although it is anticipated that material may be common to both types of presentations. Think of these histories as museum or library reference resources.</p> <p>Submissions should be suitable for library use.</p> <p>Who is Eligible— Any Far West club or council can apply for this recognition.</p> <p>Web Link to Detailed Information and Entry Form— https://fwsa.clubexpress.com/content.aspx?page_id=22&club_id=623165&module_id=353433</p>	<p>Recognition— The awardee receives an engraved crystal trophy. Historic Ski Club, Council, Ski School or Ski Patrol Designation	
<p>Description— Clubs, Councils, Ski Schools & Ski Patrols with over 50 years of operation may be designated as a FWSA Historic Organization. The organization must provide proof of operations with the request for this designation. Proof may be articles of incorporation, minutes, press clippings or other significant historic evidence and may be 1 to 10 pages of copied material. The applying organization will be required to provide a reproducible logo.</p> <p>Who is Eligible— Any Far West Club, Council, Ski School or Ski Patrol with more than 50 years of operation can apply for this designation.</p> <p>Web Link to Detailed Information and Entry Form— https://fwsa.clubexpress.com/content.aspx?page_id=22&club_id=623165&module_id=353623</p>	<p>Recognition— An electronic seal suitable for placing on your website and in your newsletter is presented.</p>  <p>Deadline— March 18, 2024</p> <p>Contact— Jane Wyckoff history@fwsa.org 949-933-9607 [c]</p>
Charities & Our Community Service Recognition	
<p>Description— The intent of this recognition program is to encourage charity and community service involvement in all our FWSA councils and clubs, to recognize a club or council for its outstanding financial and/or volunteer support to one or more charitable organizations, to show the ski world how much the FWSA encourages volunteerism and charity involvement and to show our industry partners what a big and kind heart the members of FWSA have.</p> <p>WHAT IS REQUIRED OF YOUR CLUB OR COUNCIL? To be included in the FWSA SHOWCASE video, your club or council will need to share your charity activities with FWSA. There are no specific requirements to be included in the Charities video, except clubs need to show that they did some charity work during the year. Here are some suggestions... We have last year's video attached (on the right side).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Send high resolution photos, showing the club's charity activities., brief descriptions of the photos. If just a few people are shown, give their names. • Send good quality logos of the charities that the club supports. Include the club logo, also high definition, good video quality. • Send short videos, no longer than 5-10 seconds. • Lists don't work very well in a video, as you can see in past videos. • Clubs might share their mission, maybe some short basic club information? Whatever YOU think might fit into our video. <p>Be creative, make it fun and interesting. Lots of photos with brief captions make an interesting, fun to watch video. Environment Award	
<p>Description— This recognition program encourages development of awareness and programs that educate club and council members about sustaining snowsports through conservation and protection of our environment.
