



The history of FWSA began with the founding of the California Ski Association on October 7, 1930 at a meeting of the Winter Sports Committee of the California State Chamber of Commerce at the Palace Hotel in San Francisco. Over the course of 87 years our organization has grown to become one of the largest snowsports associations in the United States. We are a non-profit membership organization of 9 regional councils, 150 clubs, and approximately 50,000 members in 12 western states.

We have developed strong relationships with our ski industry partners. Four ski resorts and their lodging partners sponsor our annual recognition awards with one week ski trips to the award recipients:

- Council's Man & Woman of the Year – Big White Ski Resort, Canada
- Safety Person of the Year – Telluride Ski Resort, Colorado
- Western Ski Heritage Award – Steamboat Ski Resort, Colorado
- Environment Award – Aspen/Snowmass, Colorado

Many other industry partners sponsor our annual Convention activities and donate ski trip packages for our Convention Silent Auction. A full list of all industry partners is available on our FWSA website.

Travel -- We have very exciting travel opportunities in the year ahead. Randy Lew led his annual FWSA Dive Trip, Sep 23-30, 2017. The destination was the Mayan Princess Beach & Dive Resort on the Island of Roatan in the Caribbean. Our annual North America Ski Week will be in Banff, Feb 3-10, 2018. Our Mini Ski Week will be to the Alaska Iditarod and Alyeska, Feb 25-Mar 4, 2018. The annual International Ski Week will be to Les Trois Vallées–Brides les Bains, France, Mar 4–18, 2018. We are also planning an adventure trip to India later in 2018. All of our trips are available to members of all FWSA clubs and direct members. Convention -- Our 85th Annual Convention was held in June 2017 in Boise, Idaho. Intermountain Ski Council and Bogus Basin Ski Club showed us that Boise is a special destination. Charlie Linville, our keynote speaker, was the first U.S. combat-wounded veteran and amputee to climb Mt. Everest (May 19, 2016). Charlie, a native of Boise, presented a fascinating story of his life and accomplishments and received a well-deserved standing ovation. Other celebrities attending the Convention were Billy Kidd (1964 Olympic Slalom

Silver Medalist), Sarah Hendrickson (2013 World Champion and 2014 Olympic Ski Jumper), and Eve Chandler (Idaho ski historian and author). 

boISE Is Excited. . .to have Hosted the 2017 FWSA Convention

After five years of planning, the 85th Annual Far West Ski Association Convention is a wrap. It started with a question mark on the weather and ended with bright sunshine and nice temperatures. Guests enjoyed The Grove Hotel, and Convention events held at the newly expanded state-of-the-art Boise Centre. Located in downtown Boise, attendees had easy access to many restaurants, shopping, museums, the capitol building, and much more.

This year's Convention was hosted by Bogus Basin Ski Club and Intermountain Ski Council. The city of Boise rolled out the red carpet, with the Mayor issuing an official Proclamation proclaiming

June 7-11, 2017 "Far West Ski Association Days".

The Convention kicked off a little earlier this year, on Wednesday, with a group participating in A Taste of Idaho, touring Boise and the surrounding area, with a stop for a dip in the famous Springs in Idaho City. The day culminated in a fabulous Dutch Oven Dinner in the Penthouse of the CW Moore building, offering spectacular views of the city of Boise. Thursday featured an exciting Rafting Trip on the Payette River. **Cascade Raft and Kayak** gave the participants a trip experience of a lifetime!

Friday morning started early for golfers, with the 11th Annual Michael German Memorial Golf Tournament at the Quail Hollow Golf Course, nestled in the Boise Foothills. A group of adventurous bikers had a fun ride to the MK Nature Center, which included lunch and a stop at Coiled Winery. It was unfortunate that the greenbelt was flooded, so riders could not get the full effect of the area. Other outdoor enthusiasts headed for Bogus Basin Mountain Recreation Area for A Day on the Mountain - riding the lift, enjoying lunch, an afternoon hike and learning what makes a ski resort run. A large group of participants attended the Wine Wobble & Pub Crawl that evening, visiting four local hot spots in downtown Boise.

The FWSA's first ever Fountain Party took the place of the traditional pool party, on the newly refurbished Grove Plaza on Friday afternoon. The Oinkari Basque Dancers were a unique introduction to their culture, and some Convention attendees joined in the dancing!

Local club members and snowsports enthusiasts were out in force to bid on great packages at the 32nd Annual Silent Auction and Snowsports Trade Show on Friday evening. Ski industry and resort representatives from North American and international destinations, were present to share information about their resorts, outdoor activities, properties and products. A portion of the proceeds from the Silent Auction was donated to The College of Idaho Ski Team, who served as bid runners.

Saturday started off with a continental breakfast and a brief opening session. Next was the Travel Expo, where club members personally met with resort representatives and tour operators to discuss and plan future snowsports and adventure trips.

The Keynote Speaker following with Luncheon was Charlie Linville, a Boise native, who became the first military amputee to summit Mount Everest. He spoke about how he worked with "The Hero's Project" on his mission. He was very poignant with his message, that success in anything in life is possible with enough determination. After two failed attempts in 2014 (avalanche), and 2015 (earthquake), he conquered the summit in 2016.

Other highlights of the Convention include the Public Affairs panels and Snowsports Leadership Academy sessions. This year's panels and sessions featured a wide array of snowsports leaders, experts and celebrities. Three Snowsports Leadership Academy sessions were offered this year: "How to Build a Successful Ski Club", "Making Love to your Members – Building and Bridging Relationships for the Long Term", and "How to Keep your Skis in Tip Top Shape and What Goes into a Great Boot Fitting". Industry partners presented bids for the 2019 FWSA North American Ski Week, and ski council honorees met with judges for the selection of this year's Councils' Man and Woman of the Year.

Saturday evening's theme was "boISe Magic" and it was "truly magic" with a terrific dinner, awards, and dancing. The Band, *Winewood* played some magical music and kept people dancing up to closing time.

Congratulations to all of the award recipients at this convention, especially to our local winners: Chadd Cripe, writer for the "Idaho Statesman", Bill Berry Award, Hard News; Bob Greenwood, Snowsports Builder Award; and Mark Barnard, Councils' Man of the Year.

Sunday's program consisted of FWSA's Annual Business Meeting, including election of officers and resolutions. Clubs and councils and their dedicated volunteers were recognized for outstanding Community Service and Communication activities. A delicious brunch was served to the Convention delegates.

A special "Thank You" is extended to all the FWSA, Bogus Basin Ski Club and Intermountain Ski Council volunteers for their hard work and enthusiasm in hosting such a successful Convention. We also extend our appreciation to our industry partners, who support FWSA by participating in the Silent Auction and Travel Expo, and supporting our Convention events and programs with sponsorships.

This year's convention was very special to me. My goal was to ensure that all delegates, guests, and industry representatives had a memorable and enjoyable time in Boise. All 75 of our local volunteers did an amazing job and made sure that our guests enjoyed themselves while here in our beautiful city.





FWSA TRIP INCENTIVES PROGRAM

North American Travel has added an incentives program for ski councils and clubs who want to enter into a partnership with FWSA to participate in the mini ski trips and adventure trips. Councils already have a partnership with the North American annual ski week program and they earn lodging and lift comps based on the number of spots that they sell on the trip. Now clubs and councils have the opportunity to earn money based on the number of people they sign up from their club/council for other FWSA trips. The amount varies by the type of trip. Basics of the program:

- The club/council President completes the Incentives Program registration form;
- The club/council selects a contract person to promote the trip by announcing it at club/council meetings; sending out emails; noting it in club/council newsletters; putting on websites; or whatever communication forms the club/council uses with its members;
- Pass out the trip registration paperwork, collect initial deposits, and get 12 or more people signed up for the trip;
- Club/council contact works with the FWSA trip leader as needed;
- The club/council receives an amount per person after the trip is over for their promotion of the trip and signing up their members.

This program is available for most FWSA North American trips except the annual ski week. Contact Nancy Ellis, V.P. North American Travel, if your club/council is interested in participating in this program.



FWSA Athletic Scholarship Program 2017

The FWSA Athletic Scholarship Program has been a very successful program since its inception in 2004 and continues to evolve as a resource of funding for junior USSA racers throughout the western United States.

Last season, Far West sponsored 14 racers throughout the west who were awarded scholarships that totaled \$13,750. We are looking to exceed that this year. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of financial need, competitive ranking, academics, and community service.

The 2017-2018 fundraising campaign began in January this year at Far West Ski Week in Breckenridge, Colorado, with \$1,700 raised from the **Karbon** raffle where the winner is awarded a new ski jacket and pants from the Karbon catalogue.

The next fundraising effort was at the convention in Boise, Idaho this June. **Whitefish Mountain Resort** and **Grouse Mountain Lodge** in Whitefish donated ski packages for the live auction on Saturday. In addition, the **U.S. Ski Team** again donated items. Finally, an additional 10 prizes were donated by individuals. Total raised: \$5,370.

Notification for next season's applications were sent out to ski clubs affiliated with the United States Ski and Snowboard Association's (USSA) Far West, Pacific Northwest, and Intermountain Divisions last March. These three divisions make up all the USSA junior racers in states with affiliated councils in Far West. 21 applicants are currently being evaluated for the coming season.

Junior racers need to raise approximately \$20,000 per season; a formidable financial challenge. That need will no doubt increase. With the help of individuals, ski clubs, and our industry sponsors, we look forward to another successful year for the scholarship program. 





BAC has a very dynamic and diverse membership who have been and currently are members of the Bay Area Snow Sports Council and Far West Ski Association Board of Directors.



Our larger Sierra Clubs are enjoying summer activities, while looking forward to the coming ski season.




