Originally from Chicago, in 2009 then eleven year old Molly Leavens moved to Park City, UT, with her mother and older sister so that she could compete in alpine ski racing. Her father remains in Chicago and commutes to Park City to be with the family. Her talent and dedication was immediately apparent, and by 2012 Molly was ranked second overall for her year group. In that year she was invited by the U.S. Ski Team to train at the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Association (USSA) Team Academy. This year, Molly is back with the Park City team because training costs were too high at the USSA Team Academy. The 2012-2013 season was another banner year for Molly. Despite an early injury, she finished the season standing: 4th in Downhill, 2nd in Super G, 10th in Giant Slalom, and 20th in Slalom. She had 12 top 10 finishes and 6 trips to the podium. This year's goal is to win at least one event at the U18 Nationals and compete in the U.S. Nationals. A 4.0 student, Molly is also active in community service. Abby McNulty, Executive Director of the Park City Education Foundation, writes: "I can not imagine another high school student who is as thoughtful, goal-oriented, and as disciplined as Molly. On top of that, she excels at her academic and [other]commitments like a champion."

FWSA's Communications program has a number of aspects, all with the goal of fostering two-way communication with our member councils, clubs, and direct and club members. At the request of the members who attended the Convention, we have developed a website search feature, which covers several of our websites, and which has been provided to Catherine and should be available on www.fwsa.org by the time you



read this. Connie Burdette has been working hard on *The Councilman*, and Leigh Gieringer will be publishing the *Far West Skier's Guide* for the winter season. We also publish the *Far West News Flash*, *Facebook* and *Twitter* posts, and a number of other communications contributed to by multiple volunteer members.

Over the summer, we have made a lot of progress toward our goal of modernizing FWSA's Communications Program. We are developing a web-based database system which will allow FWSA members to create an account to track their FWSA activities, including online registration for trips and events, and to upload the photos and videos that they want to share with their fellow club and FWSA members. The prototype was demonstrated to the FWSA board at the July board meeting, and the board approved further development and deployment. We anticipate that the system will be ready to accept FWSA's first online sign-ups by the end of November and to accept uploaded photographs and videos during the FWSA Ski Week at Beaver Creek in January.

We are also modernizing the club database, to better reflect the needs of FWSA and its member councils and clubs, and to simplify and organize the collection of the information we need. We are also developing a system that will allow members from all over FWSA to see what trips are being offered by the hundreds of clubs that make up FWSA. Our goal is to support all of our members and clubs, to maximize participation in their trips and events, as well as to offer the widest array of activities to all of our members.

VP of PUBLIC AFFAIRS

JOINT SIA/NSAA UNITE ON GROWTH ISSUE

On September 24 and 25, board members from SnowSports Industries America (SIA), the snow sports industry's member-owned trade association, along with National Ski Areas Association (NSAA) board members, joined forces in Washington, D.C. to discuss how to grow snow sport participation and to lobby around regulatory and trade issues currently affecting the snow sports industry.

The meeting began with a review and discussion of strategy and goals for growing participation. SIA President David Ingemie provided an update on the size of the in-

dustry and the trends in participation. NSAA President Michael Berry complemented Ingemie's remarks by reviewing project models and how to increase conversion rates. Both presidents also reported on the headway made at the National Ski and Snowboard Retailers Association's Snow Sports Stakeholders Meeting to collectively address participation issues. NSAA and SIA will be working together in the future to expand the efforts of the snow sports participation programs "Learn to Ski" and "Snowboard Month".

Focusing on the issue and sharing best practices became a key ingredient to this effort. The highlight seemed to be the growth of collaboration between the two groups. Their joint meeting gave both SIA and NSAA Boards the opportunity to share thoughts about our very much shared issues and goals. The five main issues being: Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act, Miscellaneous Tariff Bill, TSA Policy for Avalanche Air Bag Canisters, Water Rights for Land Resorts and Immigration and Visas.

"Time spent in Washington educating public officials about the ski industry and our pressing concerns was valuable," said Michael Berry, NSAA president. "NSAA was pleased to unite with SIA on delivering a powerful message in Washington about the impact that the ski industry has on the economy and jobs and our optimism for future success as well."

Organizers of Learn to Ski and Snowboard Month (LSSM) and Warren Miller Entertainment (WME) are motivating current skiers and snowboarders to take the Bring a Friend Challenge this winter. Sustainable Slopes Annual Report

LAKEWOOD, Colo.-October 11, 2013 - The National Ski Areas Association (NSAA) recently released its 13th Sustainable Slopes Annual Report detailing the ski industry's progress in implementing the principles of its Environmental Charter during the 2012/13 season. Among the highlights, one hundred and fifteen (115) ski areas endorsed the Climate Declaration issued this year by a coalition of leading U.S. companies called BICEP (Business for Innovative Climate and Energy Policy). The Climate Declaration calls upon federal policymakers to take action to address climate change, and states that addressing climate change is one of the greatest economic opportunities of the 21st century. "Ski areas are proactive on the issue of climate change," says NSAA president Michael Berry. "They take steps in their own operations to reduce their carbon emissions and recognize the benefits of uniting with other business interests in getting attention on this issue in Washington," says Berry.



The End of One Scholarship Campaign and the Beginning of Another

The Sierras have experienced its first couple of dustings and folks in the Rockies are seeing ski areas open. All across the west, fall is in the air and junior alpine racing programs are gearing up for another season. For the Far West Ski Association's (FWSA) Athletic Scholarship Program it is time to finish off the 2013 campaign by sending out our scholarship notices.

What a year we have had! The best ever. Our 2013 fund raising campaign brought in over \$10,000 from the raffles, auctions and donations. With our partners, the funds available for scholarships exceed \$14,000.

This year, we had thirty applicants from Washington (5), Oregon (1), Nevada (2), Idaho (1), Wyoming (1), Utah (2), and California (18). Application evaluations by the scholarship committee identified 19 potential scholarship recipients (12 women and 7 men): Washington (5), Idaho (1), Wyoming (1), Utah (2), Nevada (2), and California (8). The average Grade Point Average (GPA) is 3.92. The total value of this year's scholarships is \$13,950, a new record.

Our top point recipient was Molly Leavens, age 16, from Park City, UT. A 4.0 student, Molly stands nationally in her age group at 4th in Downhill, 2nd in Super G, 10th in Giant Slalom and 20th in Slalom. Molly will receive a \$1000 scholarship from the FWSA. Second place in the point count went to Lila Lapanja, age 18, whose home is in Incline, Nevada. Lila, a five time scholarship recipient, is going into her third year on the U.S. Ski Team. She had a spectacular year in 2013 that brought her to 2nd place in Super G, 4th in Giant Slalom and 2nd in Slalom. This year Lila will be awarded the Sierra League and Council's Frank App Memorial Scholarship in the amount or \$1,250. Our third place goes to Cai Yamamoto, age 19, from Mission Ridge, WA. Cai graduated from high school this last June and is taking a year off from academic pursuits in the quest for a college scholarship. He finished the 2013 season in 6th place in Downhill, 13th in Super G, 8th in Giant Slalom and 32nd in Slalom. Cai will receive a \$1000 scholarship from Mountain High Snowsports Club of Portland, OR. This year's Skiyente Ski Club's Erin Nicole award will go to Elyse Burandt from Spokane, WA. As the top junior woman from the Northwest, Elyse scored 20 top ten finishes and 9 podiums during the 2013 season. As overall winner of the prestigious Northwest Cup Downhill in 2013, Elyse beat everyone including the fastest junior man. This year's Erin Nicole scholarship is for \$1000. Alexandria Oseland from Crystal Mountain, WA, will be the recipient of

the Northwest Ski Club Council's \$1000 scholarship. At 15, Alexandria is the youngest scholarship recipient; but she has an impressive record standing 2nd in Downhill, 6th in Super G, and 12th in Slalom. Furthermore, she had 17 top ten finishes in 2013 including 9 podiums. We are pleased to have a candidate this year for the Castro Valley \$1,000 scholarship. Kye Moffatt from Berkeley, CA, a member of the Squaw Valley Race team and a 4.0 student, finished last season in 8th place for Downhill and a 15th for Super G. Once again L.A. Council will sponsor Kayleigh MacGregor, age 16, with a \$750 scholarship. The Mammoth racer, who is afflicted with cystic fibrosis, has overcome her disabilities to score an impressive 5 top ten finishes in 2013. Finally, San Diego Council again sponsors their native daughter Alexa Wehsener with a \$700 scholarship. A 4.14 GPA student, Alexa has continued to improve scoring her best season ever in 2013 with 6 top ten finishes and one trip to the podium. Regrettably, we did not have a candidate for this year's Bergfreunde scholarship.




