### **FWSA Grows Athletic Scholarship Program!**

With another ski season quickly approaching and early snows in Colorado, it is time to plan your ski trip with FWSA. The benefits of participating in a FWSA trip include: traveling with a group of skiers and snowboarders, friends that you already know, the opportunity to make new friends with people of like interests, value provided by volume pricing and organized activities and tours, and a trip leader to help you with agenda questions and the unforeseen issues that might arise. The FWSA Board of Directors will hold its winter meetings at the Park City Peaks Hotel in Park City, Utah. I am very proud that our Athletic Scholarship Program under the leadership of Dick Shawkey has continued to grow. Bergfreunde Ski Club (Portland, Oregon) and Castro Valley Ski Club (Castro Valley, California) have become the third and fourth ski clubs to partner in the FWSA Athletic Scholarship Program. In addition to Bergfreunde and Castro Valley, Skiyente Ski Club and Mountain High Snowsports Club in the Northwest Ski Club Council, Los Angeles Council of Ski Clubs and San Diego Council of Ski Clubs have partnered to offer grants to deserving junior racers in their respective areas. We are planning on honoring seventeen junior athletes from California, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, and Washington for their alpine ski racing performance and potential with grants of \$500 to \$1,000 to be used to cover training and competition fees. These junior athletes excel not only in competition but also in academics where they have a collective average GPA of over 38

The new 2011-2012 *Far West Skier's Guide* has been distributed to each Council and ski show that we have participated in. We are also distributing over 50% of these, utilizing Certified Folder Displays to reach the major metro areas that we serve. A big thank you to Leigh Gieringer for

## **Athletic Scholarship Chairperson 2011 FWSA Athletic Scholarships Set New Records**

A record 45 eligible applications were submitted to the Far West Scholarship Committee for evaluation in July. In addition, there were four applications that were ineligible. Applicant gender was almost an even split with 23 women and 22 men. The 45 applicants came from California (20), Idaho (2), Montana (1), Nevada (3), Oregon (8), Utah (4), Washington (6) and Wyoming (1). Their average academic GPA is 3.87.

Depending on the partnership acceptance, up to eighteen of these applications will be awarded scholarships ranging from \$500 to \$1000, also a scholarship program record. While the final number is still pending, it is likely that 10 girls and 8 boys will receive scholarships in 2011.

They come from six states: California (7), Montana (1), Nevada (3), Oregon (3), Washington (3), and Utah (1). The 2011 recipients are not only great athletes but also top scholars with an average GPA of 3.92. Sixteen of the

recipients were ranked top ten in their age group in 2011 in at least one racing discipline, and 10 of these stood in the top ten in two or more disciplines.



The top overall athlete was Lila Lapanja from Incline Village, NV, a threetime scholarship recipient, who was tops in all four disciplines and a 2011 selectee to the USSA Development Team. In addition to Lila, two other female recipients are members of the Development Team. We are pleased that for the first time there

were eight applicants from Intermountain, two of whom will receive scholarships (Rose Caston from Park City, UT, and Tara Hines from Helena, MT).

The scholarship partners program continues to grow and is making a significant contribution to the success of the scholarship program. Partners commit to sponsoring local or regional junior athletes; an arrangement that gives the partners greater exposure among local skiers.

With the addition of our two most recent partners, Bergfreunde Ski Club of Portland, OR; and Castro Valley

Another exciting council program now in progress is the Outreach Program. The Outreach Program is intended to promote FWSA as the "Voice of the Western Skier." Member ski councils are encouraged to participate in and promote FWSA and their regional ski organization at events expected to reach our target audience.

FWSA will subsidize ski council advertising at regional events to attract new club members by promotion of association/benefits of FWSA and to raise awareness of FWSA benefits among current membership ranks.

The application describes how FWSA will be promoted as the "Voice of the Western Skier" and how visitors to your event/booth will be invited to visit the www.fwsa.org web site to learn more about FWSA. The participation reimbursement is "capped" so that each council can receive a portion from the general fund for the Outreach Program.

The79th Annual Convention at Pacific Palms brought many of the Council Services programs into action. The MWOY program executed by Donn Bryant ran very smoothly. I especially like the banners the candidates wore this year. This made them very easy to identify starting from Friday night through the judging and activities on Saturday.

Lennia took over in February and managed to get the program up and running by June. Catherine Ohl did her usual excellent work on the FWSA Awards Program. The slide presentations by her on Saturday afternoon and evening were amazing.


