The Association's Western Ski Heritage program annually recognizes the best effort in the prior year that communicates the contributions to skiing from the community at large. The prize is sponsored by **Steamboat Springs Ski and Resort Corporation** and is awarded at the annual Convention. Steamboat Springs is an area rich in history and is the location of champagne powder.

The purpose of the Association's Western Ski Heritage program is to raise the awareness of skiers and non-skiers alike - the contributions made by individuals, groups and companies in all aspects of skiing - competitive as well as that of outdoor winter recreation and fitness. A parallel purpose is to convey the positive role skiing has had in its contributions to the communities in the West. The award is open to an individual or a group leader (it is not restricted to Association membership) and can be self-nominated or nominated by a club or club member. Materials and history programs will be evaluated against the objectives of the program by individuals selected for their knowledge of the history of Western skiing and that of the Association. Applications are due 4/30/2008 and evaluations will be conducted each spring. A variety of methods may be used to achieve the objectives of the program. This can include any of the following: original documentation of facets of snowsports (in the legendary Bill Berry

General Information:

Big Sky Resort was conceived and built by the late NBC newscaster, Chet Huntley. It first opened for skiing in December 1973. In 1976, Boyne USA Resorts purchased the resort and has owned and managed it since then.

Big Sky consists of three mountains with 3812 skiable acres, seventeen lifts, 400 inches of light, dry snow annually; no lift lines and the nation's second largest vertical drop of 4350 feet. Combined with Moonlight Basin, there is a total of 5,512 acres of skiable terrain.

Guests may take a day off from the slopes to experience the Yellowstone National Park. You can tour the park either by snowmobile or snow coach. There are also highly rated cross-country ski trails, snowshoeing, dog sledding, fly-fishing, sleigh ride dinners, and snow-cat dinners.

This will be the first FWSA ski week at Big Sky. Sign-ups for this trip will begin in March of 2008. Save the dates January 24 – 31, 2009 to attend the Far West Ski Week in Big Sky, Montana.

# Back from China/Tibet Les Trois Vallees and Greek isles in 2008!

Now that the winter is upon us, we need to start thinking snow. But first let's review our fantastic China trip.

FWSA took 91 people on a fast moving China adventure. We started in Beijing on September 15th, 2007 and were startled by how advanced China had become. Mary and I were last in China in 1995.



At that time, new construction was everywhere and the streets were jammed by thousands of bicyles. This time Beijing was a megametropolis of towering buildings with smoggy streets jammed with cars. After touring Beijing, e.g. Tian'anmen Square, Forbidden City, Great Wall, Hutongs, etc. we flew off to Lhasa, Tibet, where we climbed to the top of Dalai Lama's Potala Palace and spent days experiencing Tibetan life. Next we were off to Chengdu, where we saw pandas, and some of our people bottle feed baby pandas. Chengdu was the splitting point where 41 of our group went off to Xi'an to visit the world famous Terracotta Warriors.

Then, off to Shanghai and a ride on the maglev train to the airport (fastest commercial train in the world – 310 mph). The 50 re-

maining people traveled to Leshan where they saw the worlds' largest Buddha (210 feet high) carved into a mountain side. After several stops, we flew to Guilin where we traveled through bamboo, water chestnut, sugar cane and rice fields. The countryside of Guilin is like no other in the world, green covered-mountains shoot straight up into the air.

We cruised the famous Li River passing through scenic Yangshuo. We saw fishermen using cormorants (water birds) to catch fish. Finally we were off to the very modern Shanghai for a couple of days of touring, taking the maglev train to the airport. This was a trip of a lifetime. Our tour company was China Focus out of San Francisco who only does travel to China.



We have two great FWSA International trips scheduled for 2008. On March 7th we fly to Les Trois Vallees, France for our 2008 ski week. Les Trois Vallees is the largest ski area in the world. We stay at LaTania located a short distance between Meribel and Courchevel, France. Les Trois Vallees has 200 lifts and 540 square miles of terrain. Something for every skier. Our post trip extension includes

3 nights in Aixen-Provence and 4 nights in Paris. I'm sorry to say the Les Trois Vallees trip is sold out.

FWSA second international trip is a Greek Isles Adventure Trip in the first two weeks of October, 2008. We plan a 17 day tour with an optional week extension into Turkey for those wanting more. This trip is designed to be an adventure where we mix with the locals. We fly into Athens, where we board an overnight ferry at Pireas and sail to Rhodes. We spend a few days in Rhodes, fly to Crete for a few days, take a high speed boat to Santorini (tour the ancient volcano island), take another high speed boat to Mykonos for a few days, and then a private caique (boat) to Delos. From Mykonos we fly to Athens for a visit to the Acropolis, National Museum and old town. Those on the optional Turkey week will fly to Samos. From this point they visit Kusadasi, Izmire, Ephesus, Kanakkale, and Istanbul.

On all our International trips, we accept all placements based on the order deposit are received by FWSA International Travel. It's very important to us that as trips are announced that all Councils and clubs distribute the information and fliers as-soon-as-possible our members have a fair opportunity to join on any trip. ## **Snowsports Always in High Altitude**

By Richard Lubin

SNOW Sports take place at high altitude, so here are some exercises to help you get ready.

AEROBIC (cardiovascular) can include dancing, running, elliptical trainers, ski or stair machines, road or mountain biking to get ready for skiing.

## **KNEE BENDS**

Support yourself with a chair back turned sideways. Standing on one leg, bend down with a slow smooth motion. Try to get down to a 90 degree bend. Continue until you feel fatigue (the burn) in the leg. Switch to the other side. Visualize yourself carving nice turns down the hill.

#### **DUCK WALK**

This is another great exercise. Squat down and try walk-

ing. Walk backwards, sideways, varying your foot and leg angles. Try it on an incline and on stairs. *Caution*: If you have problem knees, do not go down any further than is comfortable. Consider limiting the motion to under 60 degrees.

## **JUMPING**

Try jumping side to side. Jump over an imaginary line through the middle of your body. Pretend you are on moguls or on a steep incline. Those little trampolines are great for this.

#### **BALANCE**

Try standing on one leg with no support while bending just a little.

## OTHER EXERCISES

Do exercises like Tai-Chi that help you find your "center." Try walking along a curbside, increasing the pace as you go. Good skiing and boarding is all about balance and shifting weight.

## **STRETCH**

This is very important - look at stretching exercises on the net.

The bottom line is to start thinking about being up in the snow. Incorporate these and other activities into your everyday life. After all, you can do some of these things on the phone or while you are doing other passive activities.

#### Arizona Snowbowl

On 3/12/07 9th U.S. Circuit Court William Fletcher reversed U.S. Dis- important precedent which extends trict Court Judge Paul Rosenblatt's decision that Forest Service met all procedural requirements for approval of facility upgrades at Arizona Snowbowl and use of reclaimed wastewater to make artificial snow. District Court Judge Rosenblatt had concluded that the goal of providing a reliable ski season was consistent with the Forest Service's multiple-use mandate. This case is one of the first legal challenges

to the Religious Freedom Restoration Act of 1993 This case sets an American Indians the right to practice their religion in a way and to an extent the federal government deems appropriate and adequate on public lands (not Indian reservations) instead of protecting American Indians' religious rights as they themselves define those rights and the necessary circumstances for practicing their religions. Ultimately this case is predicted to go to the Supreme Court. In October 2007 a

request for a rehearing en banc at the U.S. Circuit Court level by a 15 judge panel instead of the original 3 judge panel was accepted. See www.reclaimthepeaks.com for more information.

## **Consumer Advocacy Trends Council**

**U.S. skier/snowboarder** visits 2006/2007 were down 6.5% with total at 55.1 million primarily due to abnormally warm temperatures and below average snowfall in most regions according to annual Kottke National End of Season Survey final report. The 2006/2007 season is down 0.9% from the ten year average of 55.57 million visits.

Winter sport overall sales for specialty stores decreased 2% in dollars to \$1.782 billion, in chain stores increased 1.7% to \$550 million while internet stores (tracked for the first time) totaled \$341 million for the August 2006 through March 2007 period according to SIA (Snowsports Industries America). In specialty stores snowsports apparel gained 8% in dollar sales to \$623 million, midfats advanced up 13% in units and 20% in dollars, fat systems jumped 79% in units and 80% in dollars, and twintips climbed 11% in units and 24% in dollars while snowboard equipment sales fell -13% in dollars to \$181 million.

**Young Skiers**. Get them involved while they are young is critical to developing life long snowsports enthusiasts. The 2006 National Skier/Boarder Opinion Survey by Leisure Trends Group showed 62% started skiing before age 18 and 30% started after encouragement from friends.

**2014 Winter Olympic Games** were awarded in July 2007 to Sochi, Russia with ski/snowboard events at Rosa Khutor resort in the Kasnaya Polyana valley of the Caucasus Mountains.

**Amer Sports Corp** opened U.S. headquarters in Ogden, UT in September 2007 for Winter & Outdoor unit that includes Atomic, Salomon & Suunto.

**Jarden Corp** completed acquisition of K2 Inc which adds the brands K2, Marker, Marmot and Volkl to Jarden's Outdoor Solutions segment in August 2007.

**Bode Miller** will match his independent Team America sponsors' combined donation of \$5,000 per World Cup win over the next 3 seasons to his Turtle Ridge Foundation which has donated tens of thousands of dollars to Bretton Woods adaptive ski program, Lance Armstrong Foundation, the Boys & Girls Club and other worthwhile causes

**Mount Pegasus**, proposed Georgia indoor ski resort on 400 acres along Lake Lanier near Atlanta was presented to Dawson County Development Authority in September 2007. Plans call for one million foot indoor ski dome with 2,500 foot slope, 300 foot vertical drop, 5 runs, 2 quarter pipes, a half pipe, super pipe, mogul field and indoor snowmobile track.

**PingTian Resort** in consultation with the SE Group (designer of Deer Valley) is continuing construction of "China's first world class luxury ski resort" in the Tianshan Mountain range of northwestern Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region during winter 2007/2008 and is now expected to open in November 2008.
