WHO & WHAT'S NEW FOR 2019

<u>Mikaela Shiffrin Makes History:</u> Fighting a chest cold, *Mikaela Shiffrin* propelled herself down the course on February 16th to post the fastest second run, convincingly winning the slalom race at the *Worlds Championships* in Are, Sweden, thus becoming the first person ever to win four consecutive World Championships! Way to go, Mikaela!

<u>Sun Valley & Snowbasin Hop onboard the Epic Pass:</u> Two of the largest family-owned resorts remaining in the ski and snowboard industry will come into the Epic Pass portfolio next season. *Sun Valley* and *Snowbasin,* both owned by the Holding family, announced that for the 2019-2020 season, Epic Pass holders will get seven free days at each mountain, and half off the ticket-window price on subsequent visits. Holders of other Epic Pass versions, such as the Local or 4-Day passes, get more limited-access to the two mountains. Pass-holders at Idaho's *Sun Valley* or Utah's *Snowbasin* will get 50% off the window price at any of 18 resorts owned and operated by Val Resorts, which issues the Epic Pass. *Sun Valley* becomes the first Epic Pass partner in Idaho.

High Fives Foundation FAT Ski-A-Thon: On March 3, 2019, the High Fives Foundation from Truckee, Calif. will team up with GoPro and Vermont North Ski Shops to share the slopes of Sugarbush Resort in Warren, Vt. with over 200 skiers and snowboarders in the Eighth Annual Fat Ski-A-Thon. Prior to the event, participants will reach out to their contacts to raise funds for the Foundation. Through amazing support in years past, the Annual Fat Ski-a-Thon has become the largest fundraising event for the High Fives Foundation. The organization has set a goal of raising \$200,000 at the March 3rd event. When participants gather, they will take fun laps with friends and family, while searching for prizes in an exciting scavenger hunt. IT'S A BRONZE FINALE FOR LINDSEY

On February 9, 2019, *Lindsey Vonn* wrapped up her illustrious 18-year career as the most successful female ski racer in history, going out with a bronze medal in the downhill at the FIS Alpine World Ski Championships in Are, Sweden.

Lindsey left everything on the hill, as she competed in her final event in typical Vonn – *all or nothing* – fashion over her long career that has brought her 82 World Cup Victories, eight World Championship medals, including two gold in downhill and super-G at the 2009 World Champs in Val d'Isere, France, and three Olympic medals, including the downhill gold at the 2010 Games in Whistler, B.C.

Vonn stood on the podium one final time to accept the bronze medal in a joyous awards ceremony, as Swedish legend, *Ingemar Stenmark*, who holds the all-time World Cup win-record of 86 victories, presented the awards to Lindsey, and her 2 competitors, Slovenia's, Ilka Stuhec, who took gold, and Corinne Suter, from Switzerland, who took home the silver.

In victory, defeat, battling back from crashes and injuries, Vonn will be remembered as a vicious competitor who brought the sport of alpine ski racing to the mainstream of American sports.

"I always risk everything, all the time", she said. "That's the reason I was able to win so much. Also, the reason why I crashed so much and had so many injuries." She went on to say "I'm in a position where my body isn't allowing me to ski the way that I know that I can...and that's why I'm retiring. My body isn't letting me do what I need to do to win races. That's the best I could have done today. There's not another gear. I'm very, very happy and thankful for bronze today."
