WHO & WHAT'S NEW FOR 2019

High Five's "Fat" Ski-A-Thon a \$uccess: *Sugarbush Resorts' Valley House and Super Bravo lifts were very busy on Sunday, March 3rd. This was the time and place set for the Eighth Annual Fat Ski-A-Thon. High Fives provide grants to outdoor sports athletes who suffer from life-altering injuries, such as spinal cord or traumatic brain injuries. They also teach safety awareness and smart decision making at schools locally in Northern Vermont and across the country. Began in 2011, this event is set up for local Vermonters to spend a day skiing on "fat" skis, but it has transformed Sugarbush Resort's base area beyond the normal weekend party for expert skiers, novice skiers, adaptive skiers and snowboarders, as well as sit-skiers. Their goal, set prior to the event, was \$200,000 in on-line donations. They beat that by about \$10,000, becoming the most successful fundraiser in High Fives Foundation history. Congratulations to you all!*

Mikaela Continues to Amaze: The "dream season" continues. Having never won a Super-G race before this season, Mikaela Shiffrin won the World Cup Super-G title, and her 10th career crystal globe. This has already been an extraordinary winter for Shiffrin, who won two golds and a bronze at the World Championships, and last week, became the first skier to amass 15 World Cup victories in one season.

DESCRIPTION: The Far West Western Ski Heritage program annually recognizes the best effort in the prior year that communicates the contributions of snowsports to the community at large. The purpose of the Far West Western Ski Heritage program is to raise the awareness of snowsports participants and non-participants alike of the contributions made by individuals, groups and companies to all aspects of snowsports – competitive as well as that of outdoor winter recreation and fitness. A parallel purpose is to convey the positive role snowsports has had in its contributions to the communities in the West. It recognizes outstanding effort in the area of snowsports history to find, preserve, document and share the history of snowsports in the West. PUBLIC AFFAIRS

Northwest Ski Club Council issued a press release on March 1, 2019 expressing concern that climate change will affect the future operations of our ski areas. NW Council supports the recent actions of the members of our industry to provide leadership on climate change and we support policies to combat it. NWSCC will be an active partner in the common goal of addressing the critical issues concerning climate change.

Earlier, in January, the Outdoor Industry Association (OIA), Snowsports Industries America (SIA), and National Ski Areas Association (NSAA) announced the formation of the “Outdoor Business Climate Partnership” to provide leadership on climate change. Leaders of seven state and regional ski area trade associations including the Pacific Northwest Ski Areas Association, Colorado Ski Country USA, Ski Utah, Ski California, Ski Vermont, Ski Areas of New York, and Ski New Mexico have also joined. The “Outdoor Business Climate Partnership” is committed to providing leadership and advocacy for climate solutions across the country.

The announcement was followed in February with a press release from the resorts on Mt. Hood, OR, to support federal and Oregon state legislation designed to limit our country’s greenhouse gas emissions. The Pacific Northwest Ski Areas Association (PNSAA) followed this announcement with a press release in support of federal, Oregon and Washington legislation concerning climate change.

In the press release Northwest Ski Club Council advocated for the passage of three important legislative proposals which will significantly affect climate change:

1. Federal Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act of 2019. This Act stands out with its market-based approach to meeting aggressive emissions reductions targets while providing citizens with a dividend. This federal legislation is bipartisan.
2. Oregon House Bill 2020 which creates an Oregon Carbon Policy Office to administer the Oregon Climate Action Program. This Act would adopt an economy-wide “cap and invest” system to regulate greenhouse gas emissions in Oregon.
3. Washington House and Senate Bills which enhance the transition of Washington’s clean energy economy to a clean, affordable and reliable energy future.
