PICABO STREET OPENS ACADEMY

<u>Picabo Street Academy:</u> Picabo Street has partnered with Michelle Demschar, former USSA Domestic Development Director, to form the *Picabo Street Academy*. During her time at USSA, Michelle worked with a challenged group of athletes trying to balance their schools and athletics. They found Dan Kemp, most recently serving at USSA's TEAM Academy in Park City (until 2014), to serve as headmaster of the new school. Dan has worked for decades with elite athletes to accommodate their sports and still be prepared for college.

Creating a more flexible academic schedule is at the core of the academy, which will offer accredited courses, including Honors and AP-level classes, through an online educational partner coupled with one-on-one classroom instruction for a wide-ranging student body. "The idea that we weren't only downhill or alpine, aerials or freestyle, but that any student with a high-level extracurricular drive..... if they have something that removes them from the academic setting that should be OK. 'We will make it so that the student has the responsibility and the accountability within the academic realm to be a part of it," said Kemp. "It could be a three-year plan, a four-year, or five, but our students will truly be college ready." Picabo then added "I just want to wrap my arms around the whole thing, and say, 'Hey let's get these kids prepared to go, in a way that will keep them in the sport – or whatever – longer, (and provide) that sense of security that they're doing something about the other side of their life in the meantime'. "I love the idea of having the opportunity to mentor."
