WHO & WHAT'S NEW FOR 2016

Copper Mountain Resort is Open: Winter has officially arrived at Copper Mountain Skiers and snowboarders are celebrating today, with fresh new snow and the opening of the American Eagle chairlift. Other terrain is open as well including the Excelerator lift. On Saturday. November 19th, Olympic Gold Medalist, Ted Ligety and other members of the U.S. Ski Team will set the pace for NASTAR courses around the country at Coppers' Pacesetting Event.

Newell Brands Makes New Announcement: In the October Issue of the NewsFlash, I wrote that Newell had announced the company's intention to sell or abandon its entire collection of winter sports brands by January 1, 2017, including K2, Völkl, Marker, Full-Tilt, Marmot, Line Skis and Ride Snowboards. LATEST WORD now, is that the company will continue, even if the company cannot successfully divest itself of those brands in 2017. So, don't give up on your favorite brand.

Dynafit Ski Boots Recalled: Three models of Dynafit Alpine Khion touring ski boots have been recalled in the U.S. and Canada as incidents have occurred where the boots have inadvertently switched from "ski" to "walk" mod. Additionally, the boots' upper cuffs can separate, and in one model, the boot shell can crack, posing a fall hazard and risk of injury to the skier. These are men's, women's and carbon boots sold since October, 2015.

Tamarack Homeowners Save Ski Resort: The Tamarack Municipal Association, the owners' association of Tamarack Resort, will operate the Idaho ski area after acquiring the resort's assets and averting a tax auction that had been scheduled. The plan to begin making snow in late November, and hope to open on December 9th.

Powder Mountain Adds Acres, Lifts, Villages: Opening this season with 1,000 more skiable acres and two new lifts, *Powder Mountain* is once again the largest ski and snowboard area in the country. The lifts will open up terrain that was "quide-only" and provide access to a pair of planned mountain villages with up to 500 home sites. Powder now surpasses Park City Mountain in size...covering 7,957 acres.

Mt. Bachelor Adds New Chairlift: Mt. Bachelor's new "Cloudchaser" high-speed detachable quad lift will expand the resort's terrain to a total of 4,318 skiable acres, making it the fifth largest ski area in the U.S. Skiers and Boarder can now descend Mt. Bachelor 's southeast face beyond the Sunrise Getback through the Low East sector all the way to the East Catchline, without having to hike uphill to return to a lift.

Proposed Law Could Let You Pay for Lift Tickets with Pre-Tax Dollars: Legislation currently pending in both houses of the U.S. Congres could soon let you pay for lift tickets, season passes, ski equipment, and more with pre-tax dollars. The Personal Health Investment Today Act (Senate Bill 2218), would allow a medical care tax deduction for up to \$1,000 (\$2,.000 for

joint return or head of household), of qualified sports and fitness expenses defined as "amounts paid exclusively for the sole purpose of participating in a physical activity, including: membership at a fitness facility, participation or instruction in physical exercise or activity, or for equipment used in a program of physical exercise or activity. Stay tuned.
