WHO & WHAT'S NEW FOR 2015-2016

The town of Mammoth Lakes placed a giant birthday card in the middle of town for everyone to sign, and then presented it to Dave. Congratulations, Dave. Here's to many more!

More Resorts for Mountain Collective: The Mountain Collective has widened their geographic reach with the addition of two more destinations. Stowe joins the Mountain Collective as their first resort on the East Coast, while Taos extends pass-holder access into New Mexico. The resorts join Sun Valley, Alta, Snowbird, Aspen/Snowmass, Ski Banff-Lake Louise-Sunshine Village, Jackson Hole, Mammoth Mountain, Squaw Valley/Alpine Meadows, in the U.S. plus Australia's Thredbo, and Canada's Whistler Blackcomb. The Mountain Collective Pass includes access to 21 mountains with more than 43,400 acres of terrain and 271 lifts, with two days of skiing or riding at each of the eleven destinations.

Whistler Blackcomb Gets Personal: Whistler Blackcomb will be introducing WB+ this winter season, a new online interactive connection to the ski resort's RFID technology which they introduced last year. WB+ will give guests the option to create a personal profile in order to collect stats and data about their days on the mountain. By having their lift passes automatically scanned as they pass RFID chairlift access gates, skiers and boarders will be able to keep track of personal stats including their number of days on the slopes and total vertical feet ridden. Users will be able to make their WB+ profiles accessible to others, allowing groups to create goals and fun challenges throughout the winter.

Mt. Norquay-The Oldest Resort in North America: North America's oldest ski area, and the oldest in the Canadian Rockies, Banff's local Mt Norquay celebrates 90 years of operations this winter. The first ski cabin was built there in 1927 and the first rope tow installed in 1941. The "Big Chair" has been providing riders with views of Bow Valley since 1948. To mark their 90th anniversary, Mt. Norquay will be celebrating with many special events throughout the season.

Ski Towns Dominate: It just may be that the "ski bum" is on the path to extinction. Reports indicating that ski towns attract wealth is a pretty obvious reality. When looking at a list of the richest small towns in America, as compiled by Bloomberg Business, it is notable just how much of the list is occupied by areas associated with skiing. All of Bloomberg's Top 10 are travel destinations, but only three have no ties to skiing. Leading the pack was Summit Park, Utah, home of Park City. Other resorts making the list include: Jackson Hole Mountain Resort, Little Cottonwood and Big Cottonwood Canyon, Steamboat Ski & Resort Corporation, Breckenridge, and Pergatory.

Women's Ski Jumping News: Women's Ski Jumping USA (WSJ-USA) is pleased to announce an expanded relationship with the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Association (USSA). Beginning on October 1, 2015, USSA will assume responsibility for coaching and other operations affecting the women's ski jumping program. "The best direction for WSJ-USA is one that best serves the athletes," said Peter Jerome, interim President. "I am pleased that USSA will be taking responsibility for the national women's ski jumping program, and our partnership with UOP for our development coach, Lindsey Van. WSJ-USA will focus our organizational efforts on cultivating and supporting development programs and athletes with an emphasis on the successful Fly Girls development program. The expanded partnership is a win for both organizations and will increase operational efficiency, while simultaneously addressing the specific needs of a wider range of athletes and athletic abilities." Women's Ski Jumping USA's Fly Girls program recently concluded its second summer development program and will continue to operate and be funded directly by WSJ-USA. Members have done a remarkable job in raising awareness for the sport across the US and in providing a foundation for the women athletes leading up to their Olympic debut in Sochi," said USSA Executive Vice President, Luke Bodensteiner. The top U.S. ski jumping athletes will next be in Lake Placid, NY on October 10-11, 2015 for the Flaming Leaves Festival, which features the normal hill event of the U.S. Ski Jumping Championship.
