## **WHO & WHAT'S NEW FOR 2015-2016**

Happy Birthday Far West Ski Clubs: S'no Joke Ski Club celebrated their 30th anniversary earlier this year. Mountain High Snowsport Club celebrated their 40<sup>th</sup> birthday earlier this fall, Skiyente Ski Club turned 60, and Bergfreunde Ski Club will be celebrating their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary in the coming year. These clubs are all members of the Northwest Ski Club Council. Balboa Ski & Sports Club, a member of the Orange Council of Ski Clubs turned 60. Here's to many more years of fun activity for you all.

Happy 80th Anniversary Sun Valley: Sun Valley, America's first destination ski resort opened in 1936. They will be holding a number of special events to celebrate their anniversary throughout the year. I'm sure that we've all had some epic times at Sun Valley! These past 80 years are just "Mere Moments in the Evolution of Skiing!" Happy birthday, Sun Vallev!

Skadi Fest at Vail: Vail Resort will host the inaugural Skadi Fest, an all-women's ski event at the Colorado resort's Lionshead base, January 20-22, 2016. Skadi was the Norse goddess of winter. Vail will, in essence, be hosting a gathering of ski goddesses from near and far. It will be a weekend of female skiers being treated to customized on-mountain guided experiences with female instructors, and female-specific ski equipment demos. From film premieres to culinary presentations and wine tasting education, SKADI Fest is about the full experience, both on- and off-mountain.

**UberSki Unvails in Utah:** UberSki, hailed as the first skiing-specific foray for the ridesharing company has launched in Utah. As of December 9<sup>th</sup>, UberSki has started offering rides in AWD vehicles, along with space for your gear. A partnership with Backcountry.com, UberSki will offer rides from Salt Lake City to any ski resort near Ogden, the Cottonwood Canyons or in Park City, all for the same base rates of uberX and uberXL plus a \$4 surcharge. Uber is making a concerted effort to spread out to more resort towns, and has just opened in the Reno/Tahoe area as well.

Learn to Ski and Snowboard Month: The nonprofit Learn to Ski and Snowboard Month is partnering with the U.S. Forest Service to help encourage skiing and snowboarding on National Forest lands, including the chance to establish a world record for the largest single day for ski and snowboard lessons. The world-record attempt and a "Bring a Friend" promotion are ways to help promote the benefits of outdoor recreation in the winter and to highlight the availability to world-class winter sports on lands managed by the Forest Service. The Forest Service has a long history with the snow sports industry. Today, their federal lands account for 23 million skier visits on 180,000 skiable acres. Skiing on Forest Service-managed lands also contributes \$3 billion in local communities.

Throughout the month of January, many locations throughout the U.S. will offer special learning deals for beginners. This year, that effort includes a chance to set the Guinness Book of World Records for the Largest Ski and Snowboard Lesson taught in one day. This takes place on Friday, January 8, at 10 a.m. For those who want their chance to be a part of history being made, join us. The focus will be on beginner lessons. Participating in the event is fun and easy at many resorts located on National Forests throughout the west, including resorts in: California, Idaho, Colorado, Oregon, Nevada, Utah, Washington and Wyoming.
