DESCRIPTION: The Far West Western Ski Heritage program annually recognizes the best effort in the prior year that communicates the contributions of snowsports to the community at large. The purpose of the Far West Western Ski Heritage program is to raise the awareness of snowsports participants and non-participants alike of the contributions made by individuals, groups and companies to all aspects of snowsports – competitive as well as that of outdoor winter recreation and fitness. A parallel purpose is to convey the positive role snowsports has had in its contributions to the communities in the West. It recognizes outstanding effort in the area of snowsports history to find, preserve, document and share the history of snowsports in the West. The Award is open to an individual or a group leader (it is not restricted to Far West membership) and can be self-nominated or nominated by a club or club member. Materials and history programs will be evaluated against the objectives of the program by individuals selected for their knowledge of the history of Western snowsports and that of the Association. DESCRIPTION: The FWSA launched the Historical Recognition Program in 2008 to develop club, league and council histories. FAR WEST SKI FOUNDATION

Far West Donates Money to Women's Ski Jumping Team: The Far West Ski Association (FWSA) and the Far West Ski Foundation in their Surge for Sochi campaign jointly donated \$5,000 to Women's Ski Jumping USA. FWSA has actively supported women's ski jumping since 2009 sending letters of support to the US Olympic Committee, Federation International Skiing, and the International Olympic Committee. In 2009, *Deedee Corradini*, President of Women's Ski Jumping USA was the recipient of the FWSA Snowsports Builder Award. World Champion ski jumper *Sarah Hendrickson* was the 2012 recipient of the FWSA President's Award.

Vern Sprock Scholarship: Verne Sprock, developer and operator of Sierra Ski Ranch for 40 years, died February 10 in a nursing home in Montana aged 93. Verne and his late wife Bobbie were honored as Snowsports Builders in the 2013 FWSA convention. His daughter Kathy and son Peter are creating a multi-year scholarship in their father's name through the Foundation for the **FWSA Athletic Scholarship Program**.

Rehab and Adaptive Grants: Acknowledgments of Foundation grants have been received from the Vail Veterans Program and the Snowbasin Adaptive Sports Education Foundation (SASEF). "During the January 2014 Family Program, January 26 - 30, 2014, the Vail Veterans Program hosted 24 wounded United States military service members, their spouses and family, which included 43 children." PROTECT OUR WINTERS LAUNCHES THE POW RIDER'S ALLIANCE

Protect Our Winters announces the launch of the *POW Riders Alliance*, a group of 53 of the world's top alpine, nordic and freeskiers, snowboarders, mountaineers and polar explorers, all committed to fighting climate change. "Professional athletes are the core of Protect Our Winters – arguably, no other group has better first-hand experience with the progression of climate change and its impacts on global snowpack and mountainous regions, and certainly no other group has a greater cultural influence on the global winter sports community," says Chris Steinkamp, POW executive director.

The group is comprised of global athletes including Olympians Gretchen Bleiler, Kikkan Randall, Nate Holland, Callan Chythlook-Sifsof, Andrew Newell and Steven Nyman, pro snowboarders Nicolas Muller, Danny Davis, Arielle Gold and Jamie Anderson, freeskiers Chris Davenport, Ingrid Backstrom and Kit Deslauriers and mountaineers/explorers Emily Harrington and Eric Larsen. Also joining the group is Wang Lei, a professional snowboarder from Beijing, China. See the entire list: http://protectourwinters.org/riders-alliance. "As a group, we're touching every remote corner of the world at any given time, seeing climate change impacts in various ways," states World Cup skier and US Olympian, Steven Nyman. "Climate change is affecting our lives and careers and it's in our best interest to use our passion to mobilize the community and bring a new perspective to the policy discussion." The POW Riders Alliance was developed as a central platform for athletes to speak out and create a social movement against climate change. For example, POW recently led a group of 17 athletes and brand representatives to Washington, D.C. for meetings with US Senators and has reached over 20,000 young students with a message of climate action delivered by pro athletes. POW believes that by combining the athletes' passion with their influence, first-hand experience and immense media reach, it represents a new, powerful approach to environmental advocacy. The Riders Alliance have launched an initiative to call attention to climate change on the world's largest sports stage in Sochi, Russia in partnership with a group of graduate students from the Yale School of Forestry.
