U.S. Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame: The U.S. Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame announced ten athletes and sport builders as inductees elected to the Hall of Fame who will make up the Class of 2014. Among the inductees are Olympic champion snowboarder Ross Powers, World Alpine Championship medalist *Erik Schlopy*, noted big mountain skier *Chris Davenport*, ski instruction pioneer Curt Chase, and goggle innovator Bob Smith. Others include resort designer Joe Cushing, World Cup race winner Kristina Koznik, alpine development leader John McMurtry, women's innovator Jeannie Thoren and Ralph Miller, one of the great American ski racers from the 1950's. Their induction will take place in **Steamboat Springs**, CO on April 11, 2015.

U.S. Ski Team Names 2014-2015 Roster: Copper Mountain, home of the U.S. Ski Team Speed Center was the place to be on November 8th. Olympic gold medalists *Ted Ligety*, Lindsey Vonn, and Mikaela Shiffrin, were on hand as 42 athletes were named during a public celebration at Copper's Center Village. The event was to kick off the start of the 2015 Audi FIS Alpine World Cup and Vail/Beaver Creek 2015 World Championships winter. Far West Ski Week 2015: We're getting closer to our annual North American Ski Week, which will be held in *Whistler Blackcomb*, in 2015. The dates for the trip are January 31 - February 7, 2015. A fun week of activities is being planned by our travel staff, along with Ski.Com and all the folks at *Whistler*. There will plenty of skiing, a Welcome Party on Sunday, February 1st, a Pub Crawl, a picnic on the mountain, a Mountain Rally, and the Awards Apres Party on Friday, February 6th. The council trip leaders are taking payments now for this incredible once-a-year trip. Far West Mini Ski Week 2015: This trip to **Whitefish Mountain Resort**, March 30 - April 4, 2015, includes 3-4 days of skiing, lodging at Grouse Mountain Lodge, both Welcome and Farewell Parties, and optional activities such as snowmobile tours, day spa, Glacier Park tours, dogsled adventures, sleigh rides, and more. Far West International Trip 2015: Val d'Isere will be the destination of the 2015 International Ski Trip with a pre-trip to Paris, March 10-14, the main trip March 14-21, and a post-trip to Provence and the French Riviera March 21-28, 2015. There are actually 5 options for this trip: a) Paris & Val d'Isere; b) Val d'Isere Ski Week; c) Paris, Val d'Isere and Provence/French Riviera; d) Val d'Isere and Provence/French Riviera. Paris will NOT be sold alone, but you can do a Stand Alone trip to Provence and the French Riviera. (FWSA can assist you with transportation on a case by case basis). The Pre trip to Paris, will be March 10-14th with lodging at the Mercure Eiffel Hotel, featuring a daily buffet breakfast. Enjoy a half-day tour of Paris by motor coach with English speaking guide. You'll have an optional tour to le Palaise de Versailles and Normandy.

The week-long trip to Val d'Isere will be March 14-21st, staying at the Hotel L'Aigle Des Neiges or the Hotel Kandahar. Your stay includes 5-6 days skiing (lift tickets will be pre-sold as dates

draw nearer), a Welcome Party, an Apres Ski Party, a Farewell party, ground transportation, and luggage transfers.

Finally, the Post trip or stand-alone trip to Provence and the French Riviera on March 21st-28th, will have you staying at the Grand Hotel Roi Pene for 3 nights. Daily breakfast is included. Enjoy a 2-hour walking tour of Provence with an English-speaking guide. You can take in a full day to Luberon, Lourmain, and Provence while enjoying wine tasting along the way. After all this, transfer from Aix to Nice and take the sight-seeing tour upon arrival. You'll be staying at the Westminster Hotel, and partake in day trips to Cannes and Grasse, as well as Monaco for 4 days.

Far West Mississippi River Trip: June 19 - 23, 2015 with an additional two days - June 23-24, 2015 in **New Orleans**. This trip will be a 3-night roundtrip paddleboat cruise aboard the American Queen from New Orleans. It will be a "Southern Culture Cruise" with stops at Oak Alley Plantation and Baton Rouge, LA. SKI NATION MOBILE APP NOW AVAILABLE

Olympic Gold Medalist and World Champion, *Billy Demong* and former U.S. Ski Team member *Jack Turner*, announced the official launch of their **Ski Nation Mobile Application**, available now on iOS (iPhone). Android version launches Friday, November 21, 2014. The Ski Nation Mobile App features updated snow conditions, trail reports, trail maps, photos, and resort information for more than 950 ski areas in North America, a list that's expected to grow as more off-the-radar areas are found. All ski venues are pre-loaded including downhill alpine areas, cross-country, and even ski jumps. The list includes major resorts, regional areas, local ski hills, and community facilities. Skiers and snowboarders can also collect free digital pins to track a lifetime of all the places they've been, how many seasons on snow, gear preferences, skill, and more.

"Ski Nation is for all skiers regardless of age, experience, skill, or their home mountain," says Billy Demong. "This is the first app that includes alpine, cross country, and ski jumping." "It's the modern version of old-school ski pin collecting," says Jack Turner. "Ski areas large and small have submitted unique designs that users can keep in an online pin collection. They're in one place, won't get lost, and digital ski pins don't rust." The first version of Ski Nation is a starting platform to build an open, independent, and comprehensive network for skiers and industry members to connect. or skiers, it's free and their personal information is secure. "This is a humble start to a never-ending work in progress," says Turner. "We're a grassroots, bootstrap operation and success is only possible with the support and participation of skiers, snowboarders, and industry members across the continent. After that we'll go global."
