WHO & WHAT'S NEW FOR 2020

BECK INTERNATIONAL AWARD – A TIE: The Beck International Trophy is the highest athlete honor from U.S. Ski & Snowboard, recognizing the top athletes in international competition for the year. It is also the organization's oldest, dating back to 1931. For only the second time in history, two skiers tied for the honor. The 2019-2020 award goes to *Mikaela Shiffrin – Alpine Athlete of the Year*, and *Gus Schumacher – Cross Country Skier of the Year*. Mikaela said "It's an incredible honor to share the award with three-time World Junior Champion cross country skier Gus Schumacher". And Gus expressed his excitement by saying "Wow, I didn't know how big it, was until I realized Mikaela was the other recipient". Mikaela skis with Ski & Snowboard Club Vail, and Gus, with Alaska Winter Stars.

These two are joined by five other incredible Sport Athletes of the Year: Freeskiing Athlete of the Year, Maggie Voisin, Whitefish Mountain Resort Freestyle Team; Freestyle Athlete of the Year, Jaelin Kauf, Steamboat Springs Winter Sports Club; Nordic Combined Athlete of the Year, Tara Geraghty-Moats, New York Ski Education Foundation; Ski Jumping Athlete of the Year, Andrew Urlaub, Flying Eagles Ski Club, WI; Snowboard Athlete of the Year, Dusty Henricksen, Mammoth Mountain Snowboard Team.

NEWS FROM TAOS: While the mountain is still closed, Taos is working on putting the finishing touches on new bike trails, a via ferrata course, and adding a new ice skating rink. Since closure, they initiated: their own Goggles for Docs program, co-founded the *Enchanted Circle COAD* (Communities Organized in Active Disaster), and with the help of the entire valley community, raised more than \$100,000 to help support The *Fund for Taos*, a specialized fund for Coronavirus relief fund created by *Taos Community Foundation*.

<u>ALTERRA MOUNTAIN COMPANY:</u> Alterra is discounting renewals for Ikon Pass Holders whose seasons were cut short. On May 12th, Alterra offered renewal discounts of as much as \$200 on its Ikon passes following this year's coronavirus-abbreviated season.

<u>VAIL GRANTS REFUNDS FOR 2020 PASSES:</u> Vail Resorts is offering refunds for 2020, and holds 2021 guarantees. Vail Resorts (VR) is granting its 2019-20 season pass holders credits of at least 20 percent, and up to 80 percent if they weren't able to use their passes at all. It is also offering free "Epic Coverage" for the 2020-21 season, which will provide cash refunds to passholders for certain resort closures, including for events like COVID-19, as well as refunds for job loss, illness, and other eligible personal events. Vail is also extending spring sales deadlines until Labor Day, giving people more time to buy at the best price.

OUTDOOR BUSINESS CLIMATE PARTNERSHIP "CALL TO CLIMATE ACTION": On May 14, 2020, the *Outdoor Business Climate Partnership (OBCP*), an alliance between SIA, the Outdoor Industry Association (OIA) and the National Ski Areas Association (NSAA) joined "LEAD On Climate 2020." OBCP represents the outdoor business sector, which helps to support the \$887 billion outdoor recreation economy and its 7.6 million jobs. Alongside 330 other business leaders, all calling in from home offices and remote locations across the country, they had meetings with a bipartisan group of Congresspeople, calling on them to build back a better economy by infusing long-term climate solutions into future economic recovery plans, while working towards long-term climate solutions that include investing in a net-zero emissions economy and placing a price on carbon.

100+ SKI AREAS TO RE-OPEN IN JUNE: The easing of lockdowns in countries around the world means that ski areas, in a growing number of countries, expect to be open in June. All will operate with measures in place to prevent the spread of the coronavirus. Of the over 100 ski areas in 14 countries expecting to re-open in June, operations will be very different from before. Most ski areas will operate entirely for skiers living in the countries where the ski lifts are. In most cases, borders remain closed and travel remains difficult, unsafe and sometimes impossible. In total, all being well, 80+ ski areas will open in 6 countries in the southern hemisphere. Nearly 20 areas will be open in 8 or 9 countries in the northern hemisphere. Those countries with areas opening include: Argentina, Australia, Austria, Chile, New Zealand, Norway, South Africa, Sweden, Switzerland (Zermatt and Saas). Others who are hoping to open include: France, Italy, and Japan. In the U.S: Timberline in Oregon will re-open beginning Friday, May 15, the Beartooth Basin summer ski area from May 30. Arapahoe Basin, Colorado looks like it will also re-open in late May if given permission. In addition, there still appears to be a chance that skiing and boarding on the Horstman Glacier at Blackcomb Mountain at Whistler in BC, Canada, may happen in some form if restrictions are lifted, but that remains uncertain at present.

MOUNT ST. HELEN'S 40th ANNIVERSARY: 40 years ago, on May 18, 1980, Mount St. Helen's erupted in Washington State. If you lived anywhere near it, you will remember where and what you were doing. It was the largest eruption of any volcano world-wide. The plume of smoke and ash shot 60,000 feet up, with ash being carried as far west as Montana, and reducing the 9,677 foot mountain to an elevation of 8,635, leaving it as a flat-topped mountain. It was a spectacular sight for anyone able to see it first-hand!

FAR WEST'S 90TH CELEBRATION: Still happening! Far West Ski Association is turning 90 on October 7, 2020. A celebration of **some kind**, is still in the works, but remains to be seen in what form. The Palace Hotel, in San Francisco, is where it all got started in 1930. Far West has grown from 4 Councils in 3 states, to 10 Councils in 12 states, along with approximately 140 ski clubs during our history. We are preparing a "Celebration Book", a compilation of the history of FWSA in its current form, and plan to have that available at that time. IN SUPPORT OF HEALTH CARE WORKERS - COVID-19

Still happening! The medical profession can use whatever assistance it can get. Ed Ariniello, U.S. Outdoor Store, in Portland, Oregon, recently registered his sporting goods store, as a drop-off point for Goggles for Docs, a national effort to collect new and used ski goggles for hospitals in desperate need of protective eyewear. They repurpose the eyewear for use by medical professionals at hospitals across the country. "We all need something to do," he says, "something we can contribute." The image of doctors looking as if they just came straight from shredding Mt. Hood might seem slightly ridiculous, but the idea came from a physician in New York, whose aunt coaches downhill racers. Hospitals from across the country make requests through the Goggles for Docs website, with donors committing to supply a certain number. So far, the group has donated nearly 13,000 pair of goggles.
