**FAR WEST CONVENTION – DATES CHANGED TO OCTOBER 7-10, 2021:** Over the past couple weeks, Far West Ski Association has explored various options to avoid postponing our 2021 convention at the *San Diego Marriott Mission Valley* in San Diego, California. After some discussion of possibly holding a Virtual Event, we decided to give ourselves, our members, and ski partners more time to get through the pandemic, get their vaccinations, and move further down the road, to a better level of comfort. The result of that... we have come to an agreement with the *San Diego Marriott Mission Valley* to now hold a **Fall Event**. We can still do all the same activities that we had planned for June. The weather will be nice, and we'll be able to enjoy the sunshine and blue skies of beautiful San Diego. **DANGER IN THE BACKCOUNTRY:** Last week 15 people in the US died in avalanches. The highest weekly total ever recorded! Are you prepared? Are you educated? Have you been trained? Just recently, North American Snowsports Journalists Association (NASJA) hosted a webinar, entitled "*Danger in the Backcountry*" along with The Bryce and Ronnie Athletic Snow Safety Foundation (BRASS) that was extremely thought provoking. With backcountry equipment sales up over 137% in the last 3 years, many more snow sport enthusiasts are venturing out of bounds. Side Country is Back Country... **it is not controlled and not patrolled!** At the end of last ski season, when COVID shut down the lifts, there were more than 50 human triggered avalanches in Utah. One lucky victim (he survived) was recording his run on Strava, which showed he tumbled down the mountain at 77 mph! Last month I spoke on the inherent risks of so many more skiers, boarders, and snow-shoers heading out of bounds, and not knowing **what they are doing!** Please, please be safe out there. Check with your local areas. Have there been any avalanche warnings? If so, stay home!! Be safe, not sorry!

**MR. "GS"- TED LIGETY ANNOUNCES HIS RETIREMENT:** Two-time Olympic champion, *Ted Ligety* has announced his retirement, capping a storied 17-year career. Ligety announced on Tuesday that he will be retiring. An Olympic gold at the 2006 Torino Olympic Games in the alpine combined and a gold in giant slalom at Sochi in 2014, Ted has podiumed in all major FIS Ski World Cup events throughout his career, including slalom, giant slalom, alpine combined, super-G and downhill. He made history at the 2013 World Championships in Schladming, Austria, winning three gold medals. In doing so, he became the first, since Jean Claude Killy, 45 years prior... in 1968, to win three or more golds in one World Championships. His achievements include 5-time World Champion, 3-time World GS Champion, 5-time GS titleholder, 336 World Cup starts, 25 World Cup victories, 52 World Cup podiums, and the only American male to win 2 Olympic gold medals in alpine skiing.

**LAST SKIER STANDING:** *Black Mountain, New Hampshire*, on the heels of the ultra-marathon, cross-country bike rides, and other such events, has the "Last Skier Standing" event. Set at exactly 1,000 vertical feet elevation, a herd of 80-plus skiers clamored up the slope last weekend. Each skier had one hour to complete a lap by skinning to the top and skiing back down before the next lap starts on the hour every hour until there is only ONE—the *Last Skier Standing*. By hour #42, *Ben Eck*, and runner-up, *Jeremy Arnold*, a 40-year-old father of three, were the only two left competing. The pair continued the race for another 18 hours until Arnold completed 60 laps, leaving Eck to complete the ever-important victory lap, his 61st, to win the race. Fueled by frozen gas station pizza and hot Tang, the 28-year-old Ph.D. candidate from Northeastern University, completed the feat on telemark skis. I saw a lot of cars parked beside the side of the trail that weren't really there. I saw a pirate ship and a pink panther, all kinds of crazy things. 61 laps, 61,000 feet. Whew!

**U.S. SKI AND SNOWBOARD HALL OF FAME:** In mid-January, the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame hosted an evening with Art Clay and Ben Finley from the National Brotherhood of Skiers in a Zoom meeting. It was an enjoyable and enlightening time, listening to the stories that both Art and Ben had to tell of how the NBS got its start, and how they've grown since that day in 1973. They were to be inducted into the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame in 2020, but due to the COVID Pandemic, the induction ceremony had to be postponed. Once that can happen, they will be duly inducted. In 2015, at the Far West Convention in San Diego, Art Clay and Ben Finley received the *Far West Snowsports Builder Awards*.
