FAR WEST CONVENTION – DATES CHANGED TO OCTOBER 7-10, 2021: The San Diego Council of Ski Clubs is busy, busy with plans for the 88th Annual Far West Convention. Please change your calendars to these **new dates!** We want to see you all in San Diego October 7-10, 2021 for some outstanding Snowsports Leadership sessions, informative Public Affairs Sessions, a great Silent Auction and Trade Show, as well as some fun outside activities including: biking on Coronado, Sailing in San Diego Harbor, golfing, kayaking and paddle boarding and an Oktoberfest-themed Pub Crawl. RESORTS ROLL OUT 2021-2022 SKI & SNOWBOARD PASSES: Alterra's **Ikon Pass** products available now. The price of the top tier Ikon Pass is the same as last year at \$999, while the Ikon Base Pass went from \$699 to \$729. Renewing passholders will get a \$100 discount on a full pass or a \$70 discount on the base pass. All products are available with payment plans, and Ikon is still offering its Adventure Assurance, which allows purchasers to defer the full value of an unused pass to 2022-23 by Dec. 9.

Vail Resorts has not yet unveiled the particulars about its **Epic Pass** product suite, though details appear to be imminent. Epic Pass marketing, which promises "This Changes Everything," suggests some alterations to the offerings, rolling out March 23.

The **Indy Pass** also has not shared its 2021-22 lineup yet. At the end of February, the group dropped its 2020-21 Spring Pass, a \$149 product, offering two days at each of Indy's 63 independent partner resorts, valid from March 1 to the end of the season. Spring Pass holders can get a third day at any of the resorts for 25 percent off the ticket rate.

The Mountain Collective Pass 2021-2022 can now be purchased for \$499. Passholders will receive two days at 23 world-class destinations with half off additional days, zero blackout dates and for a limited time, a free 3rd bonus day at the resort of your choice. They are also bringing back their "No Questions Asked" guarantee which allows you to receive a full refund on your pass purchase any time prior to August 1, 2021.

A NEW "EARLY BIRD" SPECIAL: "Have Vaccine, Will Travel". People over the age of 65 have been among the first in line to receive Covid-19 vaccinations. And they are leading a wave in new travel bookings. Across the United States, older people have been among the first in line to receive their Covid-19 vaccinations. And among hotels, cruise lines and tour operators, the data is clear: Older travelers are leading a wave in new travel bookings. Americans over 65, who have had priority access to inoculations, are now ready to go! Older people are more eager to travel in 2021 than other age groups, and also more likely to link the timing of their travel to when they receive their vaccinations, according to a January survey conducted by the travel agency network Virtuoso. While some older adults are focusing on short distances and Covid-19 precautions at their destinations when it comes to post-pandemic travel, others are enthusiastically planning to just go big. The 65-plus demographic is losing out on their golden years and they're understandably eager to get back out there. Most of them say they've been vaccinated, and they're comfortable now traveling to a destination. The vaccination gives them the confidence to travel to a remote spot. So....go for it. Go big or go home!!

TAMARACK RESORT "SKY PASS": Tamarack Resort has unveiled a new community-focused lift pass to reward local students for their commitment to school and to support increased access to outdoor recreation. The SKY (Students-Kids-Youth) Pass will provide free, year-round Tamarack lift access to local K-12 students in the Valley County and New Meadows schools, as well as homeschool students with primary residence in these districts. The SKY Pass is set for Memorial Day weekend and will be an ongoing program. "The students in our valley represent the future of this community and Idaho," said Tamarack president Scott Turlington. "As they dream and work toward what they want to be when they grow up, we hope the experiences and memories made on our mountain help shape who they become. This is an opportunity of a lifetime that could lead to a lifetime of opportunities." In developing the program, Tamarack coordinated with area non-profits, the superintendents of the Cascade, McCall-Donnelly and Meadows Valley school districts, private schools, and local home school families. "This is the type of opportunity we've wanted to provide our kids for a long time—a chance to learn and love lifetime sports like skiing, snowboarding, and mountain biking," Cascade superintendent Jeff Blaser said. "We're thrilled with how this will strengthen our community, and look forward to working with Tamarack to get our kids to the mountain."

TOP TEN CHAIRLIFTS OF THE WEST: Mt. Baker – is the snowiest. Chair 8 has the "best gravity train" in the nation. Whistler Blackcomb – the largest resort in North America. Their Peak Express opens to 5,000 acres of terrain, and the Glacier Express, the highest chair on Blackcomb Mountain, accesses extensive terrain covering thousands of acres. Crystal Mountain - the biggest ski resort in Washington state, with Chair 6, being the best. Mammoth Mountain Ski Area – Chair 23 – gives you access to "beast mode" terrain. Mt. Bachelor – Northwest Express – 400+ acres of the best ungroomed powder, chutes, and "good-time" terrain. Alpine Meadows – Summit Six – Keyhole run is a 55 degree drop of pure exhilaration! Squaw – KT22 Express – gateway to "experts nirvana" on the Fingers and McConkeys. Mt. Hood – Timberline – the Palmer Lift provides the longest ski season in North America. (The U.S. Ski Team does summer training there). Kirkwood – Cornice Express – the last run to get skied out.

<u>ADDITIONAL ADD-ONS TO THE "INDY" PASS</u>: Waterville Valley, New Hampshire and Saddleback, Maine have now joined the Indy Pass. Both resorts will provide two days of skiing and riding to all Indy Pass holders during the remainder of the 2020-2021 and the 2021-2022 seasons.
