STEAMBOAT EXPANSION GETS GO-AHEAD FROM U.S. FOREST SERVICE: Steamboat Resort Corp. has plans for a multi-year expansion of the resort to make it the 2nd largest resort in Colorado. The first expansion in 20 years, they will be adding a new 10-person gondola...the Wild Blue Gondola, which will load at the base area and finish at the summit of Sunshine Peak for a 3.16-mile-long ride. Mid-station would be at the Bashor Bowl. The Wild Blue Gondola will allow the resort to remove the Priest Creek lift and replace the old Sundown Express 4-person with a more efficient and higher capacity 6-person chairlift. Steamboat currently has 2,965 skiable acres, but, with the expansion, would jump to the state's second largest with 3,616-acres. Along with this, there are plans for an après ski plaza, new restaurants and bars, new lodging, a ski beach, and an ice rink. All this will be happening by 2022-2023 season in Steamboat.

VAIL ANNOUNCES \$315 MILLION DOLLARS IN LIFT UPGRADES: Cited as a "monster project", Vail Resorts will drop 19 new lifts on 14 mountains by the start of the 2022-23 ski season. There's a six-pack of six-packs, the company's first eight-pack chairlift, a new gondola. There are fixed-grip quads replacing antique double-tower side-by-sides, new fast lifts replacing old fast lifts, and new lifts where there were none before. There are terrain expansions. There are projects everyone was asking for and projects no one was asking for but just about everyone will love. This huge investment comes on top of the \$120 million_that will plant six new lifts at five mountains (Okemo, Beaver Creek, Crested Butte, Keystone, and Breckenridge), and relocate another ahead of this coming ski season. Vail CEO, Rob Katz, confirmed that all lifts slated to be replaced are scheduled to operate for the 2021-22 ski season, which means they will have one enormous construction summer on the horizon.

SQUAW VALLEY BECOMES PALISADES TAHOE: The famed *Squaw Valley* ski resort near Lake Tahoe is changing its name, after a long debate and input from Native American tribes. The California resort made the decision to change the name last summer, as many U.S. institutions and communities contemplated the legacy of centuries of racism. In recent decades, several other locations, in states from Minnesota to Oregon, have dropped the term from place names. The change is being praised by the Washoe Tribe, whose ancestral lands include the valley where the resort is located.
